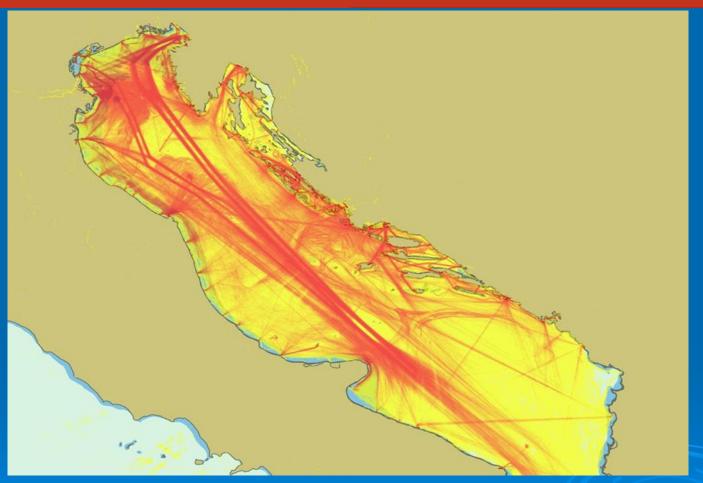

ANNUALLY CA. 6.100 SHIPS WITH DANGEROUS CARGO ENTERS THE ADRIATIC TYPES: 85% TANKERS, 9% LPG, 4% CHEMICALS AND 2% CONTAINER SHIPS

EXISTING REGIONAL SCHEMES AND ARRANGEMENTS adopted by IMO

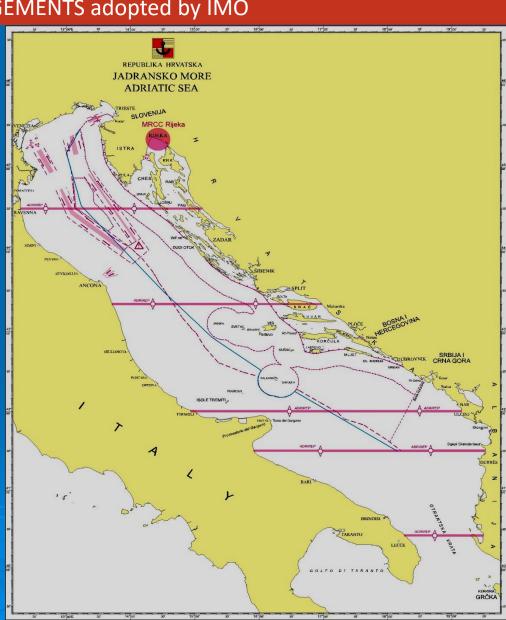
ADRIREP- Mandatory ships reporting system

- IMO RESOLUTION MSC .139 (76)
- Operational from 01 July 2003
- Monitoring dangerous/ polluting goods traffic
- Participating Italy, Slovenia, Albania, Montenegro and Croatia
- APPLIES: All oil tanker ships of 150 GT and above. All ships of 300 GT and above, carrying on board, as cargo, dangerous or polluting goods, in bulk or in packages
